This will include the analysis and assessment of market support mechanisms, rural development measures, agri-environmental and trade policies;</li> <li>• coordinate and monitor research projects in the field. This will include validation and evaluation of research results, drafting analytical reports, including policy analyses and scientific publications.</li> </ul> <p>He/she should have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• good knowledge of agricultural and/or trade policies;</li> <li>• proven expertise in using economic modelling tools to analyse agricultural and/or trade policy;</li> <li>• good analytical and organisational skills, ability to adapt to a wide range of different tasks;</li> <li>• good communication skills and demonstrated ability drafting clear and accurate reports.</li> </ul> <p>The senior scientist must have at the time of applying a minimum of 10 years research experience at the post-doctoral level, or a minimum of 15 years research experience after the first university degree giving access to doctoral studies (which may include periods of training such as a master's degree) in a field relevant to the JRC's scientific activities.</p> <p>A very good level of written and spoken English is essential and knowledge of at least one other EU language is compulsory.</p>
